A national study has been conducted, and the flood insurance rate maps for Darlington County were updated as a result. If you or someone you know owns property in or near a flood zone, or if you own a business in or near a flood zone, please come to the Public Meetings scheduled in September to view the maps. This is the beginning of the 90-day appeal process, so if you disagree with the findings, the information you gain at these meetings will be of value to you.
